Dear Parents and Carers,

What a fantastic start it has been to the new school year. It has been so great to see everyone back, smartly presented in their uniforms and ready to learn. Our return to school has obviously been helped by the tremendous weather too!

We now need your help to move into the next stage managing the Covid pandemic. We are adhering to all Local Authority and National Guidance – for more information on this, access to the risk assessment and Covid outbreak planning please see our website. You will also find there a wealth of support materials for you and your family to access.

You can find the key changes for the coming weeks summarised below:

Mask wearing	All parents/ Carers encouraged to wear face coverings on site.	Mask wearing is at individual discretion however, if attending a meeting on site you will be requested to wear a mask. (This may change in line with national and local guidance)
Water bottles	Children need a filled water bottle each day in school - these can be refilled on site	No Change



Items needed in school	Pupils need to bring their book bag, lunch if applicable. No other items. No other personal items are permitted.	No change
Bubbles	Pupils in class bubbles with individual	Bubbles - Year R bubble Year 1 and 2 Bubble Year 3 Bubble Year 4 and 5 Bubble Year 6 Bubble
Personal hygiene	All bubbles have separate toilets. Children encouraged regularly to wash their hands and use hand sanitiser. No shared equipment where possible. Shared equipment must be sanitised between usages.	No Change
Enhanced cleaning measures.	Enhanced cleaning measures in place including a deep clean on Friday.	No Change
