Dear Parents and Carers

I hope this newsletter finds you well prepared for a busy few days. It has been a very long term and everyone in school is very tired and looking forward to a break. Looking back over this term there is much we can be very proud of.

In Design and Technology, the children have been learning how to prepare and cook food in our *Festive Food* focus. It has been lovely to hear the children singing carols ready for the carol concert and getting ready for *Young Voices* next term. The *Gifted and Talented Reading* team is working hard to read their three books ready for the quiz against other schools in February. The Reception children have been 'buddied up' with children in Y6 and it is lovely to see them interacting with each other developing the Whitley Character values of Friendship, Courage, Resilience, Kindness, Gratitude and Honesty.







In sports the children in Y5 and 6 benefitted greatly from having the swimming pool in September. Many children were not at all confident in the water and by the end of the course they could swim 20 meters and completed survival skills. Our children competed admirably in the indoor athletics competition, coming fourth overall with some outstanding performances from our pupils.

They can spend them each half term on small prizes or save them for a better prize.

It was lovely to see so many of you on *Parents Evenings* and at the *Carol Concerts* this week. This strengthens the partnership we have established and demonstrates to your children we are learning together. Anne Richards from St James's Church came to lead our fun assembly today and the children learnt how chocolate features in the Christmas story.

On Friday 15th December we had our Learner of the Term special

assembly, which was a fantastic surprise for the winners because their parents were invited to see them receive their award. These children all demonstrated one or more of our Core Learning Values of Commitment, Opportunity, Respect and Excellence.
