Introduction

Deciding which school to choose is one of the most important decisions parents, carers and children have to make. We want to make sure that your child's first admission to school is as smooth as possible. It is important that you have all the information available so that you and your child can make an informed decision about the school you would prefer them to attend.

We aim to make sure that you have the best chance of securing a place at the school of your choice. For admissions in September 2022, we were able to offer 94.4% of children their first preference and 99.1% of children one of their three preferences. Some schools, however, receive more applications than there are places available. This means that parents who apply late can be unsuccessful in getting a place at one of their preferred schools. It is therefore important that you apply by the closing date and use the information in this booklet and advice from Admissions to ensure you have the best chance of getting a place at your preferred school.

School places are offered on the basis of the priorities in each school admissions policy. Please look at the details of the policies for each school that you are interested in, so that you can see whether your application would have a high priority or not. It is important to make realistic applications because where you are not successful with any of your choices we will have to offer you a place at the nearest school with places available, which may be some distance from your home.

To apply for a school place please apply online or on a paper application form by **15** January 2023.

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Why should I apply online?

You will receive notification of the result of your application by email or you cancheck your account for details on 17 April 2023 There is no risk that your application will be lost in the post You will receive an email confirmation that your application has been received It is quick and easy to use You can apply 24 hours a day, 7 days a week It is safe and secure You can change your application up to the closing date (**see below)

Online Admission Process

Last year 88.6% parents submitted online applications requesting a primary school place for September 2022. The online facility for primary school admissions for September 2023 will be available from 1 September 2022 until 15 January 2023 and is a quick and simple way to make your application. It will also enable you to know the result on 17 April 2023 rather than waiting for a letter that will be sent out with the results.

Some primary schools will make their computers available at certain times for parents to complete and submit an online application form. You should check with your local school to find out whether they provide this service. Alternatively, check with your local library for support in completing your online application.

If you decide you want to change the schools or any information you can do this online up to the closing date, 15 January 2023. Please remember to **resubmit your application after reviewing or making any changes to your application.

You will receive an email by 5pm on 17 April 2023 informing you which school has been allocated for your child.



Section 1 General information

School Admissions Flowchart September 2023



The Government requires every Local Authority to draw up a Coordinated Admissions Scheme for admissions to mainstream primary schools. Our scheme covers every school in the Coventry area, except independent schools. The main aim of the scheme is to ensure that your child receives a **single offer of a place** at a primary school, based on your preferences.

How does the admissions process work?

If you would like your child to go to any maintained primary school or academy you will need to apply online via the Coventry City Council website: www.coventry.gov.uk/schooladmissions

Parents will be able to apply for up to 3 schools. We strongly recommend that on your application form, you list the 3 schools that you would like your child to attend. There is no advantage in listing fewer than 3 schools or including the same school more than once. You must include your catchment area school if you want to apply or be considered for a place at that school.

If any of the schools you have listed receive more applications than there are places available, your application is assessed against that school's published admissions criteria. We will offer you a place at the school you ranked highest if your application meetsthe admission criteria for more than one school

An offer will be sent to you on 17 April 2023. If there is not a place available for youat any of the schools you have requested, we will allocate you a place at your nearest school with places available.

Admission Criteria

For all children, we will try to offer a place at the school listed first. Parents are advised to read the admissions policies of all the schools requested so they can judge the likelihood, or not, of being offered a place at the school they most prefer. Details on admission criteria can be found in Section 2.

It is important that you read all the criteria so that you can decide which schools your child is most likely to be offered a place at. Some children are not offered a place at any of the schools listed on their application because there are other children who meet the criteria better than they do.

For example, in community schools children who live in the catchment area or have a brother or sister at the school will have a higher priority than those living outside the catchment area.

For the September 2022 entry, 30 pupils did not get a requested school on 16 April 2022. In most cases, this was because they did not request other schools.

KEY FACTS

If we can allocate a place at more than one of your preferred schools we will offer you a place at the one you rank the highest.

You must include your catchment area school if you want to apply for a place at that school.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

Some pupils may have special educational needs and/or a disability during their time in education. All schools are required to have policies and a SEN information report about their provision for special educational needs which must be made available to parents via their website. Links to local primary schools can be accessed via the Local Offer on the Local Authority's website which can be found at: www.coventry.gov.uk/sendlocaloffer

All schools must also have an Equality Scheme which sets out the school's arrangements to support pupils with disabilities and shows how they will increase access to education for disabled pupils.

Schools are responsible for arranging help for pupils with special needs and disabilities. The Local Authority provides a range of support services that are available to schools to assist staff and individual children.

Support services are provided for pupils with hearing and / or visual impairment, general learning difficulties, social emotional and mental health difficulties, speech and language and autism. The Education Psychology Service also provides support and advice to teachers and parents of pupils in relation to a wide range of learning difficulties.

Despite extra help, a very small number of pupils continue to have difficulties and may require a fuller statutory assessment of their needs. Under the Code of Practice for Special Educational Needs, an Education, Health and Care Needs assessment would then be carried out. Information on the statutory assessment process is available from either your child's educational setting or from the Local Authority (see Local Offer website above).

If parents believe that their child has difficulties and needs that the school is unaware of, or they are concerned about the arrangements being made, they should speak to the head teacher or the school SENCo in the first instance.

Please note that for any children who have special educational needs but do not have an Education, Health and Care Plan, or who are undergoing an EHC needs assessment which is scheduled to be completed after the 15 January deadline, parents will need to apply for a mainstream school placement through the usual admissions process.

Accurate Addresses

You should use your current permanent address where you are living at the time you fill in the application and include the Council Tax Customer Reference Number for that address. Please make sure that the address and postcode you give us are correct because we may use them to see whether you qualify under a particular admission criterion. We regularly check addresses and if details are not correct we will withdraw the offer of a school place. For example, it is not valid to state the address of a childminder, grandparent or any other relation.

A pupil's home address is considered to be a residential property that is the child's only or main residence. At the time places are allocated, proof of permanent residence at the property concerned may be required. Where documentary evidence can substantiate to the satisfaction of the Local Authority that care is split equally between parents at two homes, please check the policies of the schools you are applying for to check how your address will be determined.

WARNING

The Local Authority will withdraw your offer of a school place if you have given incorrect information regarding your child's address.

Change of Address

If after completing your application you move address, and the move takes place before the deadline of **15 January 2023**, you should email

rising5@coventry.gov.uk with your new address as this may alter your priority and/or preferred school.

If you move after 15 January 2023 it will not be possible to take your new address into account until **after** the initial allocation of pupils to schools has been made on 17 April 2023.

You should be aware however, that there may not be places available at that time. If this is the case you will be informed of your right to appeal to an Independent Appeal Panel.

Late applications

All applications received after 15 January 2023 will only be considered after offers are made to all on time applicants on 17 April 2023. This means that late applicants are only likely to get places at schools which are not full on 17 April 2023. Details in section 2 show which schools were full last year.

After 17 April 2023 all late applications made up to 2 May will be considered along with applicants who have had a change of circumstances e.g. those who moved addresses

too late for their new address to be taken into account. We will then make offers to all those in a second round of offers in May 2023.

Receipt of Applications

If you apply online you will receive an acknowledgement email. If you have returned a paper application form you will be sent a receipt within 14 days.

If you do not receive this receipt, then please email the team immediately at rising5@coventry.coventry.gov.uk or telephone 024 7697 5445. Without this receipt, your application will not have been received, which means that your child will not be offered a school place.

Frequently asked questions about starting school

When can my child start school?

In Coventry children start infant and primary school the September following their fourth birthday. The law says all children must start school at the beginning of the term following their fifth birthday. If a child attends an infant school, they will transfer to a junior/primary school in the September following their seventh birthday.

What if I feel that my child is not ready to start school in September 2023?

Some parents do feel that their child is young for their age, or there may be other reasons for wanting to delay entry to school. In these cases, you may be able to defer your child's entry or a child can attend part-time until they reach compulsory school age.

However, this should be discussed with the head teacher of your preferred school before submitting your application. Children must, by law, start school full time by the beginning of the term after their fifth birthday.

Where a parent of a summer born child wishes to defer entry until the following academic year and wishes their child to start in reception this will mean the child would be taught out of their normal age group. You should still make an application before 15 January 2023 but must notify us on the application that you want to request a place in Reception from September 2024 providing details of your reasons which will be passed to each school for consideration. You should receive a decision letter before 17 April 2023 about whether all or any of the schools will be prepared to consider an application for 2024. Please note there are no guarantees that such applications will be successful, but each case will be considered individually.

I am not sure which school I want my child to attend and would like to visit the school before making my choice.

You should contact the school you are interested in and they will arrange a date and time for you to visit or visit the school's website for information on open days.

When should I apply for a school place?

The first year of school is called Reception Year. You will need to apply for your child's school place in September of the year before your child starts school. The online application process starts from 1 September 2022 for children born between 01/09/18 and 31/08/19 who are starting school in September 2023. All applications must be made by 15 January 2023.

How do I apply?

An online application form is available at <u>https://www.coventry.gov.uk/school-</u> <u>admissions/primary-school-admissions</u> follow the link to the online application. When you submit your application, you will receive an acknowledgement email. <u>Supplementary forms</u> for Leigh CofE Academy and Seva School can also be downloaded but must be returned direct to the school in the paper format. Advice is available from Admissions staff in making your application. If you apply using apaper application form this application will be acknowledged within 14 days.

It is your responsibility to contact us if you do not receive an acknowledgement.

I need to apply for a place for more than one child.

You should complete a separate application for each of your children. You will then receive a separate acknowledgement for each submitted application. If you do not receive an acknowledgement for each child, you must contact Admissions staff.

Can I write to support my application?

Yes. You have the legal right to explain your reasons for wanting a particular school, including philosophical or religious reasons. However, these reasons will only be taken into account if they are directly linked to the admissions criteria for the schools you have listed on your application.

What address should I use on my application form?

For more detailed information please see page 10 of this booklet "Accurate Addresses."

If I register my child at a school, does this guarantee them a place there?

No. You will only be considered for a place at a primary, infant or junior school if you submit an application at www.coventry.gov.uk/schooladmissions and include that school as a preference.

If my child currently attends a nursery class in one of my preferred schools, will they be guaranteed a place in the reception class?

No, the nursery your child attends does not affect the application you make for reception class. The law does not allow for this as some parents/carers decide not to send their children to nursery but are entitled to the same chance of sending them to a primary school that they want. Also, the policy of the city council is for nursery classes to service a wider area than a single school's catchment area. This means that the number of places in the nursery class is often greater than the number of places in the reception class in the same school. Your application will be considered in the same way as those for children who do not attend the nursery, and it is vital that you make a new application to apply for a reception place at the school of your choice.

I want to apply for a place at a Faith School. Do I have to fill out different forms?

Leigh CofE Academy and Seva School have an extra <u>supplementary form</u> for parents to complete if you want to receive higher priority on the basis of your faith. Further details about their admissions policies are in Section 2.

I want to apply for a place at a Catholic School. Do I need to attach any extra information?

Yes. If you apply to a Catholic school and your child is a baptised Catholic then you can receive a higher priority on the basis of your faith if you provide a copy of your child's

Baptism certificate or a letter from your Minister confirming your child's Baptism by 15 January 2023, directly to the school you are requesting.

Section 2 gives details of the Catholic schools' policies. You must also tick the box on the online or paper application form if your child is a Catholic and include details of where and when your child was baptised.

We went through the primary admissions process three years ago with our elder child. Has anything changed?

Yes. The admission numbers and policies of schools often change, so it is very important that you check details of individual school policies, details of these can be found within Section 2 of this booklet along with previous years allocation data. You should put 3 choices on your application (including your catchment school) and apply on time. Even if you already have a child at the school you need to apply for a place for your younger child.

I know which school I want my child to go to. Why should I request other schools?

If you only list one school you cannot be certain that your child will be offered a place there, and if you are unsuccessful we then allocate the nearest school with a place available. This may not be your catchment area school. If other local schools have more applicants than they have places, you run the risk of being allocated a school some distance away. You are strongly recommended therefore to use all your preferences and to include your catchment area school. doing so does not reduce your chance of getting your first preference school.

How can I find out more about a particular primary, infant or junior school?

You will find some basic information in this booklet. You can also ask to visit the school and talk to the head teacher. Details of OfSTED inspections can be found at <u>www.ofsted.gov.uk</u>. School details can be found at <u>www.coventry.gov.uk/schoolcontactdetails</u>

I need a school with before and after school care. How do I know which schools provide this?

To find out whether schools provide breakfast clubs, after school clubs or other services, contact the schools directly. You can find contact details in the individual school pages in Section 2 of this booklet. Alternatively, you can contact the Family Information Service for more information on childcare in your local area either via e-mail

How do I find out how far away I live from my preferred school and which is my catchment area school?

Information regarding catchment areas (which is not always your nearest school) can be found at <u>www.coventry.gov.uk/catchmentareas</u>. If you require details about the distance from your address to a school, please email <u>primaryadmissions@coventry.gov.uk</u> and include 'Distance information request' in the subject box

How can I find out which secondary school a primary school feeds into?

There is a feeder school link between the Catholic primary schools and the Catholic secondary schools in the city. You can find out more about which schools are linked by checking the individual schools' details in this booklet or by checking the admissions policies for the schools via the link; <u>www.coventry.gov.uk/schoolcontactdetails</u>

Seva School is an all through school, therefore those pupils attending the primary school will be able to automatically continue to attend until Year 11. There is also a link between Sidney Stringer Primary Academy and Sidney Stringer Academy. You can find out more about which schools are linked and the level of priority by checking the schools admissions policies.

For other Academies, the places at secondary schools are not determined in any way by which primary school a child attends.

What if I do not live in Coventry but want my child to go to a Coventry school?

We treat all applications equally, no matter where you live. However, you must complete an application to the Local Authority you pay your council tax to. Your Local Authority will then contact Coventry who will in turn inform them if they are able to meet your request. Your Local Authority will then inform you on 17 April 2023 of the outcome of your application. However, if you do not qualify for a Coventry school, your Local Authority will be responsible for making sure your child has a school place. Please make sure you read the admissions policies of Coventry schools within this booklet. They can also be found <u>here</u>. Many have policies which include priorities based on catchment areas and distance. So, this may reduce your priority for a school if you live outside the city.

I live in Coventry. Can I apply for a place at a primary school in another Local Authority area?

Yes. If you are a Coventry resident, you can apply for a school place in another authority by completing Coventry's application and including preferences for schools outside the city.

However, if your 3 preferences of schools are all outside Coventry, we would strongly advise that you include a Coventry school in your local area or your catchment area school as at least one of these preferences. This will give you a higher chance of receiving a suitable school place offer on 17 April 2023.

What if there are changes to the information I have submitted on my application form?

You are able to make changes to your online application, before the closing date 15 January 2023. Please remember to re-submit your online application each time you make changes or view a completed application. If you have submitted a paper application you can make changes by emailing rising5@coventry.gov.uk or calling 024 7697 5445.

What happens if I move after the deadline for receiving applications?

If you move after the deadline of 15 January 2023 it will not be possible to take your new address into account during the initial allocation. We will only be able to use your new

address for allocating a place from May 2023. You should be aware that there may not be places available in oversubscribed schools at that time.

What happens if I miss the 15 January 2023 deadline?

If your application is late it will not be dealt with until after 17 April 2023. You will not receive a letter regarding the outcome of your application until May 2023 and it is very unlikely that you will get a place in any of the popular, oversubscribed schools.

Only applications which we receive by 15 January 2023 will be considered as on time.

What can I do if I don't get the places I want?

Your allocation letter will explain the reasons why it was not possible to offer you a place at your preferred school and the process for appealing against this decision. Your child's name will also be included on a waiting list(s), which means that we will consider your child for any places that become available after the initial allocation on 17 April 2023. There is no guarantee however, that a place will become available or that you will get one if it does. Being on a waiting list for one school does not prevent you from visiting others. We would strongly recommend you visit any preferred school. You can decide to accept our offer of a place at another school and still go on a waiting list for any school you have received a refusal for.

For all schools in Coventry, places that become available after 17 April 2023 allocation will be offered by applying the admissions criteria to everyone on the waiting list.

You have the right to appeal against all refusals for primary school admissions. This means that you have a chance to put your case to an independent appeal panel made up of people who have had no connection at all with the original decision. Going through the appeals process does not guarantee you a place at the school you are appealing for and does not affect your position on any waiting lists for other schools.

How do I get onto the waiting list for a school?

If you are not offered a place at a school you placed as a higher preference to one you have been allocated, then you will automatically be placed on a waiting list for that school/those schools. This will continue until a place can be offered to you, or until the 31 December 2023. After this date parents will be required to submit a transfer application form to register their renewed interest in the preferred school otherwise you will be deemed to have withdrawn your interest and removed from the waiting list.

Can I find out where I am on the waiting list for a particular school?

Admissions staff will be able to inform you of the position you hold on the list. It is important to remember that you can move up or down this list depending on whether other children come onto or go off the list. After the initial allocation on the 17 April 2023 you can request to go on any schools waiting list. This will then be looked at in the second round of allocation in May 2023 along with any late applications received. As this is open to all applicants there can be a considerable amount of change to the waiting lists at the second round of allocation. You can come off or go on the list at any stage in the process. For this reason we can only guarantee the position of your child on the list on the date of communication.

If places become available and there are more children on the waiting list than places, how are the available places allocated?

If there are more children on the list than there are places available we will allocate the places to those who best meet the admissions criteria. This will include any late applications. We will use the individual schools criteria as highlighted in their school <u>admissions policies</u>.

How do I find out if I am eligible for help with transport?

The Local Authority can offer assistance for travelling to school, but only for those fitting the qualifying distance and other entitlement criteria. Pupils applying for assistance with travel must live within the Coventry boundary and be of statutory school age i.e. 5–16 years of age. Pupils may be eligible for free travel if the distance from their home address to their nearest primary school at which places are available is in excess of two miles in the case of a child aged 5-8 and more than three miles for a child aged eight years or over. In each case the distance measured is by the nearest available walking route between the home address and the school. Pupils aged 8-11 whose parents/carers are in receipt of the maximum level of Working Tax Credit or who are entitled to free school meals will qualify for free school transport if they live more than two miles from their nearest school with available places. How does the government's policy on Infant Class sizes affect my child's admission to school?

By law, no child at Key Stage I should be taught in classes of over 30 pupils. This may affect you. If there are more than 30 children wanting to go into a class, we will use the admissions rules (oversubscription criteria) to decide who gets a place. If you do not get a place in any of your preferred schools, you can appeal against our decision to an Independent Appeals Panel. However your appeal will not normally be successful if it were to lead to a class of over 30. Further information on the appeals process is in Section 6. If your child is not offered a place at a voluntary aided school or academy, please contact the head teacher for details of their appeals procedure. Does the council offer help with the costs of uniform?

No, we do not operate a uniform grants scheme. Individual schools may be able to offer support depending upon your financial circumstances. What do I do if I am a member of UK armed forces or a crown servant returning to the UK from a posting abroad?

The School Admissions Code requires that for families of UK armed forces or Crown servants returning from overseas to live in Coventry, admission authorities must allocate a school place in advance of the family arriving in the area, provided their application is accompanied by an official letter declaring a relocation date. Children of UK service personnel and other Crown Servants will be treated as meeting the residency criteria for a

catchment area once proof of posting has been provided.

Can I refuse to accept a school offer if it's not one of the schools I wanted/selected?

Unfortunately, we are unable to remove a school your child has been offered unless we can offer an alternative school with places available. You can discuss availability with the Admissions team. There is no guarantee by requesting one of the alternative schools that a place will be offered as this will depend on how many other requests we receive for these spaces.

Can I have a friend ring on my behalf to talk about my application form?

Due to GDPR regulations the Admissions team can only speak to the parent who made the application unless they provided details of an alternative contact within the application details.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

Parents of children already attending Nursery Classes will also need to complete an application in order to request a place at their preferred school. The Local Authority cannot guarantee that a pupil admitted to a school's nursery class would be admitted to that school.

Section 2 Coventry schools

Primary schools in Coventry serve children between the ages of 4 and 11 years. In most areas one school will provide for all primary age pupils; in one area there are separate schools for infants (aged 4-7) and juniors (aged 8-11). All schools are co-educational.

The city council's policy is to admit children to primary school in September provided they have reached the age of four by the 31 August. However, children must start school at the beginning of the term following their fifth birthday.

Each primary school provides detailed information about its curriculum, organisation, SATs results, pupil behaviour, progress monitoring and other matters such as uniform policy and open days. You will be able to obtain this information in individual school prospectuses, which are available from the school direct or via the schools' own website.




Catholic Primary Schools in Coventry

All individual policies will contain details of how the school defines the terms used in their policies. There are some details which are common to all policies:

All children with an Education, Health and Care Plan that name the school will beadmitted before all other applicants.

Also children who were previously looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted, or became subject to a child arrangements order or a special guardianship order. This also includes those children who appear to have been in state careoutside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result ofbeing adopted *A looked-after child is defined in Section 22 of the Children Act 1989.*

2. Children who live in the catchment area served by the school, who have a brother or sister attending the school provided that the brother or sister will continue to attend that school the following year

3. Other children who live in the catchment area served by the school.

4. Children living outside the catchment area with a brother or sister who currently attends the school provided that the brother osister will continue to attend that school the following year;

5. Children of Staff who have been employed at the school for two or more years at the time of application for the school place; or recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage <u>– refer to policy for definition</u>

Section 3 How offers of places are made

The Local Authority will inform all Coventry residents of the outcome of their application by letter or email.

If you applied online:

Emails will be sent by 5pm on 17 April 2023. If you do not receive your email you can log in to your online account and will be able to see which school your child has been allocated to.

If you applied by paper:

Parents who submitted a paper application will receive a letter or email confirming the school offered by the 19 April 2023. If for any reason you have not received your letter or email by 20 April 2023, we will provide you with information on the outcome of your application over the telephone.

If you are not satisfied with the decision, you can discuss your concern with a member of the Admissions staff. At this time you may wish to change your preferred options or register an appeal to an independent appeal panel. Staff in Admissions will advise you on the steps you need to take to do this. **Further information on the appeals process is in** Section 6.

After 17 April 2023 parents can make changes (eg: address changes), make requests for places at other schools and also make a late application up to the 2 May 2023. Please email your request to <u>rising5@coventry.gov.uk</u> or call 024 76975445. From the 3 May 2023 we will put together all late applications and changes of preference and complete a second round of offers by the end May.

If places subsequently become available at oversubscribed schools, they will be allocated to children amongst the outstanding requests who have the highest priority according to the admissions criteria, regardless of whether parents have appealed. These requests will continue to be considered for any available places until the 31 December 2023.

Waiting List

The Local Authority cannot always offer places at a preferred school. If this is the case, the child's name will be automatically placed on the waiting list for the schools they have applied for. If places become available, the Local Authority will allocate the places to those who best meet the admissions criteria.

After the 17 April 2023, all late applications and changes of circumstances will be considered. Many of these children will not receive a place at their preferred school and will also have their name added to waiting lists in May during the second round of allocation. As this is open to all applicants there can be a considerable amount of change to the waiting lists at the second round of allocation.

All applicants will be placed in order based on the admissions criteria. This means that your position on the waiting list **may go up or down depending on how others joining/leaving the list meet the admissions criteria.** Voluntary aided schools and academies will operate their own lists in conjunction with the local authority.

Waiting lists will remain in operation until the 31 December 2023. After this date parents will need to make a new request/application to remain on the waiting list at their preferred school otherwise we will consider that they no longer wish to be considered for places at the school.

For Voluntary Aided Schools and academies please check details in their policies in Section 2.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

If you have not got a place at your preferred school, you have the right toappeal. Children can move up or down the waiting list.

Having a place on the waiting list is no guarantee that a place will become available

The position your child is, on the waiting list is as of the day you enquire. There will be no changes to the waiting list from 17 April until we have completed the second allocation round so information on changes to waitinglist positions will only be available from 31 May 2023

Parents who have applied for places outside the city should contact the appropriate authority direct to discuss the appeals process and the position onany waiting lists.



Transport Meals and Milk

School travel and transport

One of the things to think about when deciding your preferences is how your child will get to school. The Local Authority can offer assistance for travelling to school, but only for those fitting the qualifying distance and other entitlement criteria detailed below.

Most schools in Coventry now have a School Travel Plan – a document which sets out a package of initiatives to encourage families to consider walking, cycling or travelling by bus. Using their School Travel Plan grant, many schools have improved their facilities by providing new cycle parking, waiting shelters and safer entrances.

Some schools have also benefited from schemes to make pupils' routes to school safer, such as pedestrian crossings, traffic calming or improvements to footpaths and cycle routes.

Others have established initiatives to encourage walking and reduce congestion at the school gate, such as:

Walk once a week: schools encourage walking on at least one day per week and rewardthe children who take part.

Park and stride: parents park at a location away from the school, such as a supermarketcar park and children walk the last part of the journey.

Walking buses: groups of children walk to school together supervised by adult volunteers.

Many schools also offer cycle training, delivered by the City Council's Cycle TrainingTeam

Qualifying distances for free travel

We have a duty to provide free home to school transport for children who live within the Coventry boundary, are of statutory school age (5 - 16 years of age) and meet one of the following criteria:

General entitlement

Free transport will be provided for pupils attending the nearest qualifying school at which places are available if the distance from the home address to the school is:

more than 2 miles for children aged 5 to 7 years

more than 3 miles for children aged 8 to 16

Please note: The 2-mile limit will also apply to children over the age of 8 from low income families.

In each case this is shortest walking route between the home address and the school measured by which a child, accompanied as necessary, may walk safely.

If however, you successfully apply for a place for your child at a school that is not the nearest school with places available, you will not be eligible for a free travel pass unless you qualify under the low income rules.

Low income entitlement

There are extra ways in which low income families may also qualify for free travel. Low income families are defined as those who are entitled to free school meals or who are in receipt of their maximum level of working tax credit. Children from low income families will be entitled to free travel to if:

Aged 8-11 and attending the nearest qualifying school which is more than 2 miles from their home

Exceptional circumstances

Where pupils do not qualify for free travel on distance grounds, in certain exceptional circumstances a child may be eligible for free transport. Each application will be considered on its individual merits, taking full account of all the circumstances put forward. Please see the appeals section for further details.

School meals

Primary schools provide meals for pupils at midday and a choice of menu is offered (a hot meal or a packed lunch). Menus are planned to ensure a high nutritional content. Pupils requiring alternative diets for medical or religious reasons are also catered for.

All children in Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 & Year 2) will be eligible for free school meals. However, you will still need to submit an online application form, which you can complete here; www.coventry.gov.uk/Applyforfreeschoolmeals

Completing an application will guarantee that your child's school receives all of the funding they are entitled to. If your child is due to start Reception in September 2023 you will receive further information from the school.

Eligibility Criteria

The Government does not allow us to recognise any other benefit other than those mentioned below. If you are not sure, please contact the Free School Meals team.

Free school meals are available to children of families who are in receipt of:

Income Support Jobseekers Allowance (income based) Employment and Support Allowance (income based) Guarantee Credit (the Guarantee element of State Pension Credit) Universal Credit (UC) Until 1 April 2018, all UC claims were eligible for free school meals, however, From 1 April 2018, UC claims will only be eligible for free school meals if the totalnet earned income is under £7,400 per year OR if the child was eligible for a freeschool meal on 01/04/18 Where the child was eligible for a free school meal on 01 April 2018, they will remainentitled to a free school meal regardless of any change in parental income until theyfinish the phase of education they are in (primary or secondary) as at 31 March 2023 Any child who becomes eligible for a free school meal between 01 April 2018 and 31 March 2023 will remain entitled to a free school meal regardless of any change in parental income until they finish the phase of education they are in (primary or secondary) as at 31 March 2023 Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have a total annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190 We have temporarily extended free school meal eligibility to include some children ofgroups who have no recourse to public funds (NRPF). These groups are subject to a maximum household earnings threshold of £7,400 per annum. These groups are: children of Zambrano carers; children of families with no recourse to public funds with a right to remain in the UK on grounds of private and family life under Article 8 of the European Convention on Human

Rights:

children of families receiving support under Section 17 of the Children Act 1989 whoare also subject to a no recourse to public funds restriction.

These groups are subject to a maximum household income threshold of £31,500 per year for London, and £28,200 for areas outside of London. See the <u>London or outside</u>

<u>London section</u> if you are unsure as to which threshold applies for your circumstances.

We are also temporarily extending eligibility to children of a subset of failed asylum seekers supported under Section 4 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999. This group is not subject to a maximum household income threshold as these families are not able to work.

This extension covers both children who are attending school and children who are self-isolating at home because they or a member of their household have tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19).

Parents receiving Working Tax Credit for four weeks after their employment finishes are entitled to free school meals during that period. This also applies to parents who start working less than 16 hours per week (please seek advice about this from the Benefits Agency)

Children who receive Income Support or Income Based Job Seekers Allowance in their own right are also entitled to receive Free School Meals.

In cases where children receive education who have not attained compulsory school age **(nursery age children)** they will only be eligible to receive a Free School Meal if they receive education both before and after the lunch period.

Please note: If you receive Working Tax Credit only, your child is not eligible.

Entitlement is to the value of the current price of the standard school meal.

All applications for free meals should be made online via; <u>www.coventry.gov.uk/applyforfreeschoolmeals</u>

You should email freeschoolmeals@coventry.gov.uk if you change address or change benefits or any other changes of circumstances so that we can keep our records up-to-date and ensure you receive the benefit you are entitled to.

If your child will be attending a school outside Coventry, you will need to make an application to the relevant Local Authority.

Pupil Premium

When you successfully apply for free school meals the school will receive extra government funding, even if your child does not want the meal. This additional funding will be used to help children from lower income families to do their very best at school. Please let your school know if you think you may qualify.

School milk

Milk is provided on medical grounds, approved by the Health Authority, to pupils in nursery, primary and special schools. Parents in current receipt of Income Support or Income Based Job Seeker's Allowance receive this milk free of charge. There is a nominal charge for other pupils qualifying for milk on medical grounds.

Nursery milk

The Welfare Foods Regulation Scheme 1996 provides for free daily milk for all pupils under 5 years of age attending Nursery Schools, Nursery Classes or Reception Classes participating in the scheme. Please enquire at your child's school.

Subsidised milk

Individual primary schools may choose to supply milk at a subsidised price to primary pupils. Please enquire at your child's school.

School uniform grants

Coventry City Council do not operate a uniform grants scheme however your school may be able to offer support depending upon your financial circumstances. Section 5 Transferring from Infant to Junior School

You only need to apply for a junior school place if your child is in Year 2 at St Andrew's Church of England Infant School. Please apply online at

www.coventry.gov.uk/schooladmissions or contact the school for an application form. Parents of children in primary schools need not apply, as the children will continue through the junior phase in the same schools.

Parents have the legal right to express a preference for the school they wish their child to attend. If **Eastern Green Junior School** receives more applications than it has places available, then places are allocated using the oversubscription criteria below.

1. Children who, at the time of admission, are in the care of a local authority or are provided with accommodation by the authority (looked after children). Also children who were previously looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted, or became subject a residence order, child arrangements order or a special guardianship order. This also includes those children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted

A looked-after child is defined in Section 22 of the Children Act 1989

2. Children who currently attend St Andrew's Church of England Infant School

3. Children who live in the catchment area served by the school, who have a brother or sister attending the school or St Andrew's Church of England Infant school, provided that thebrother or sister will continue to attend that school the following year

4. Other children who live in the catchment area served by the school.

5. Children living outside the catchment area with a brother or sister who currently attends the school or St Andrew's Church of England Infant school, provided that the brother or sister will continue to attend that school the following year;

6. Children of Staff who have been employed at the school for two or more years at the timeof application for the school place; or recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.

7. All other children. If it is not possible to meet all of the requests in any one of the categories described above, the City Council will prioritise the requests based on the distance to the school.

If parents apply for junior school places outside Coventry then the details of those schools policies will be available from other local authorities.

What the law says about parental responsibility, parental preference and rights to appeal

Definition of a parent includes

All natural parents, whether they are married or not.

Any person who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility for a child or young person.

Any person who, although not the natural parent, has the care of a child or young person.

Who has parental responsibility?

Natural mother (unless and until an Adoption Order is made) Natural father not married to mother but jointly registered the child's birth with themother (for births registered after 1 December 2003 in England and Wales) A father who marries the mother after the birth of his natural child acquires parental responsibility from the date of birth A man married to the biological mother at the time of the child's birth Person with a Residence Order (RO) in their favour in respect of the child whilst the RO remains in force A person named in a Child Arrangements Order (CAO) as the person with whom the child shall live, whilst the CAO remains in force A guardian of the child appointed by the Court A man with whom the child's mother has made a "parental responsibility agreement" A man on whose application the Court has made a Parental Responsibility Order" Adoptive parents named in an Adoption Order Local Authority named in a care order(the above list is not exhaustive)

What does care mean?

A person has care of a child if they live with and look after the child, irrespective of their relationship with the child. This person is considered to be a parent under education law.

Schools need to be informed of the names of all the parents, people with parental responsibility or persons who care for a child in order to ensure that all persons who have rights relating to a child are consulted about important decisions.

It is therefore important that you co-operate with the school staff by providing the information they require. If changes are made to your family circumstances or if orders are made under the Children Act which relate to the child it is vital that you keep the school fully informed.

Parental Choice

An admission authority has a duty to meet parents' preferences for a school place up to their published admission number. Parents do not have a right to choose which school their child will attend only the right to express a preference. In 2022, 94.4% of first preference requests for primary school places were met. The individual school pages in this booklet give details of the number of last year's applications and their outcomes for each school.

Where you have been refused a school place you have the right to appeal that decision to an Independent Appeal Panel. Appeals for admissions into Reception class in September 2023 will be heard in May – July 2023.

Please Note: You must make an application and be refused a place at each school you stated as a preference before you can make an appeal for that school.

Infant class size

The law states that in any ordinary teaching session infant classes (Reception, Years 1 & 2) must not contain more than 30 pupils with a single teacher and the admission authority can therefore refuse admission on infant class size prejudice grounds if the admission of an additional child would breach the infant class size limit and there are no measures that the admission authority could take to avoid this without prejudicing the provision of efficient education or the efficient use of resources.

Admission of children of UK service personnel and other crown servants

In line with the School Admissions Code (2.21) families of UK service personnel with a confirmed posting to Coventry or Crown servants returning from overseas to live in Coventry can be allocated school places before their arrival in the city if they provide an official letter that sets out their relocation date and a unit postal address or quartering area address.

This means that any schools with places available must allocate a place for a child before the family arrives in the city. Where a school is full you have the right to appeal to Independent Appeal Panel and/or to be placed on the waiting list. If families do not request a school with places available, then Coventry City Council will allocate a place at the nearest school to the intended address which has places available.

Infant class size appeals

Where the authority has been unable to meet your preference you have the right to appeal to an Independent Appeal panel.

In an infant class size appeal the panel may only uphold an appeal where they are satisfied that:

Grounds:	Appellants need to show
(a) the admisson of an additional child/children would not breach the infant class size limit; or	The number of children in the class is less than 30 to a single class teacher

(b) the panel finds that the admission arrangements did not comply with admission law; or	The admission arrangements including the co- ordinated admission arrangements were in contravention of the School Admissions Code or the School Standards and Framework Act 1998, and had that not been the case your child would have been offered a place
(c) were not correctly and impartially applied and the child would have been offered a place if the arrangement had complied and had been correctly and impartially applied; or	That a mistake has been made when the application was processed that meant your child missed out on getting a place that should have been offered to them
(d) the panel decides that the decision to refuse admission was not one which a reasonable admission authority would have made in the circumstances of the case	The decision to refuse to admit your child was 'perverse in the light of the admission arrangements' for example it was outside the range of responses open to a reasonable decision maker, or it defied logic and no sensible person could have come to that conclusion

Other appeals

From Year 3 onwards when deciding whether to allow a parent's school appeal the panel's decision is based on consideration of the prejudice that would be caused to provision of efficient education and/or the efficient use of resources at the school in respect of which the appeal has been made, balanced against the prejudice that would be caused to your child in not being allocated a place at the school.

Appeal Outcome

Where an appeal panel allow your appeal, the admission authority must admit your child. If you wish to discuss the appeals process further, please e-mail schoolappeals@coventry.gov.uk

Further Appeals

Parents who have appealed unsuccessfully can apply for a place at the same school in respect of a later academic year and have the further right of appeal if that application for a school place is unsuccessful.

Parents do not have a right to a second appeal in respect of the same academic year, except where:

The City Council (where it is the admission authority for a school) agrees there were faults in the first appeal which may have significantly affected the outcome

The City Council (where it is the admission authority for a school) accepts a further application for a place at the school because of a significant and material change in the circumstances of the parent, child, or school, but this has been turned down.

It is the policy of the City Council where it is the admission authority of a school not to consider repeat applications unless the significant and material change relates to matters that would affect the level of priority which would be given to the application in accordance with the admission oversubscription criteria.

Admission Numbers

The School Standard and Framework Act 1998, referred to in this booklet as the 1998 Act, and the School Admissions Code 2021 requires the City Council, as the admission authority for Community and Voluntary Controlled schools, the governing body for Voluntary Aided, and Trust Schools, and the Academy Trust for Academy Schools, to admit pupils on request up to the school's published admission number.

The published admission number applies in respect of the normal year of entry (year Reception and year 7) and is based on the Net Capacity Formula. The calculation takes account of the amount of teaching space the school has available. The admission number therefore is a reflection of the physical capacity of the school.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

Appealing for a school place does not affect your position on the waiting list.

Section 7 Transfers between Schools

In Year Transfers

When a child enters primary school or transfers at 11 to secondary school, it is normally expected that he or she will continue at his or her school throughout their school career. However, we do know that there may be times when a parent feels that a transfer is needed. As a parent, please think carefully before making an in-year transfer request. A change of school may not be the solution and if undertaken hastily may worsen the situation. There is clear evidence that the attainment levels of children who move schools are significantly lower than those who remain at the same school throughout their primary education. Parents considering a transfer should also take into account that if you choose to move your child transport assistance will not be available.

How to apply

If you have just moved into the city, application forms for admission to school are available via the website at www.coventry.gov.uk/primaryinyearapplication

If you wish your child to transfer schools within Coventry please contact the school your child currently attends to discuss your request with them. This will give an opportunity to resolve any difficulties with the school. If a transfer is appropriate then you will need to complete the application via the above website.

Supplementary forms for Leigh Church of England Academy and Seva School can also be downloaded from the individual school pages via <u>www.coventry.gov.uk/schoolcontactdetails</u> However, these must be returned direct to the school in the paper format. Advice is available from Admissions staff inmaking your application.

If you wish to apply for in-year admissions at All Souls Catholic Primary School, Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Primary School and St Mary and St Benedict Catholic Primary School, please contact the school directly.

If you are currently living overseas and are intending to move to Coventry, or have recently moved to Coventry from overseas, and require a school place, please contact Access to Education officers on 024 76975491 or email <u>SettlementTeam@coventry.gov.uk</u> for support and advice in making your application.

All applications are processed in a rolling programme, which means that parents will be sent a decision via email within 10 working days. Around school holidays when schools will be closed and unable to view applications, this period can be longer.

Alternative schools

In some areas there is likely to be a small number of schools that have places available, particularly for some Year Groups. The distances your child has to travel may therefore be considerably longer. If there are no places available, and you still would like a place at a particular school, your child will be placed on the waiting list for the school requested and you will have the right to appeal to an independent appeals panel. There is however, no guarantee that this would be successful. For information on a school's waiting list and

appeal process, please view the school's admissions policy via www.coventry.gov.uk/schoolcontactdetails

Whatever year group your child is in, it's important that if you are considering moving schools, you need to make sure that the school you choose is the right one for your child. The best way to find this out is to visit the school you are interested in - speak to the headteacher (with an appointment) if you can.

Transport

If you decide to move your child, the Local Authority will NOT provide free transport even if you live outside the travel limits for the school (2 miles for key stage 1 and 3 miles for key stage 2). Journeys to a new school may involve additional buses, extra costs and travelling time.

Fair Access Protocol

All Coventry schools are required to sign up to an in-year fair access protocol.

The aim of this protocol is to reduce the time that vulnerable children spend out of school and to ensure that vulnerable children are admitted to Coventry schools on a fair basis, making sure that no school is asked to take a disproportionate number of pupils presenting with challenging behaviour or who have been excluded. Any children that are considered to require a school place through this protocol will be given priority over those on waiting lists and can be admitted to schools even when the school is full.

Application for places outside the normal age group

Where a parent/carer seeks a place for their child outside their normal age group, they must state which year group they are requesting and why they want this year group on the application form. Parents/carers will then be contacted to discuss the matter further as requests will be considered on the circumstances of each case and in the child's best interests. Each school governing body will need to make an individual decision. There are no guarantees that such applications will be agreed. However, where the application is not agreed a letter setting out the decision and reasons for it will be provided along with any rights to appeal.

Admission of children of UK service personnel and other crown servants

In line with the School Admissions Code (2.21) families of UK service personnel with a confirmed posting to Coventry or Crown servants returning from overseas to live in Coventry can be allocated school places before their arrival in the city if they provide an official letter that sets out their relocation date and a unit postal address or quartering area address.

This means that any schools with places available must allocate a place for a child before the family arrives in the city. Where a school is full you have the right to appeal to Independent Appeal Panel and/or to be placed on the waiting list. If families do not request a school with places available, then Coventry City Council will allocate a place at the nearest school to the intended address which has places available.

IMPORTANT NOTE

Until a transfer has been arranged your child should continue to attend their present school and will remain on roll until the request has been agreed. Parents are responsible by law to ensure that their children attend school every day and are liable to prosecution if the child is absent without authorisation from the school.

Section 8 - Jargon buster

Whilst we have tried to make everything as easy as possible to understand, the process can seem quite complicated. Here is a small guide to some of the words/phrases we have used.

Admissions Authority – the group responsible for dealing with your child's application. This will either be a Local Authority or the Governing Body of the school.

Admission/Oversubscription criteria – a set of rules that are used to decide who is given places at each school

Allocation – offering places to parents.

Catchment Area - local area served by school

Community Schools – Local Authority schools whose admissions are organised by the Local Authority.

Free Schools – Free schools are new academy schools. They are independent of the local authority and funded directly by the Department for Education. Any suitable group can make an application to establish a free school, including parents, teachers, charities, community groups and businesses. They are able to set their own curriculum and admission policy.

Independent schools - fee-paying schools which you have to apply directly to for a place.

Initial Allocation – this is when you will be told at which school your child has been offered a place (17 April 2023).

Local Authority – your Local Authority is the Council which you pay your council tax to.

Oversubscription – when more people want a school than there are places available.

PAN – Schools' Published Admission Number

Preferences – where you would like your child to attend school – the more you like the school, the higher the preference.

Voluntary Controlled Schools – voluntary controlled schools in Coventry are Church of England Schools although anyone can apply for a place. Their admissions are organised by the Local Authority

Voluntary Aided Schools – voluntary aided schools in Coventry are Catholic, although anyone can apply for a place. The governing body sets the admissions criteria.
