Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are all well and are enjoying the warmer weather this half term. We had a professional photographer in school this term and he has taken some great pictures of the learning in school. We intend to update all our marketing materials with these pictures over the next twelve months.

We have started the new Jigsaw PSHE learning, *Changing Me* and the children have enjoyed learning about things that will be different in the future and that this is an inevitable part of growing up. We are preparing them for mental and physical changes and for next year in school. This can be a complicated area to teach due to the

children's different starting points and so please be prepared for some questions from curious children.

Our partnership with the local *Community Police* force continues to strengthen and in order to teach the children about *British Values* and the *rule of law,* we have organised a number of parent and student workshops. Our curriculum focus this year has been on developing the Health and Wellbeing through a number of initiatives such as mindfulness through PSHE, My Happy Mind Programmes, and staff training on understanding neurodiversity. Well done to all the children in Y4 who worked so hard and took the *Multiplication Table Check* last week. We are looking forward to seeing how well they have done. Last year our average was 20 out of 25. Knowing your times tables will enable the children to carry out more complex problem solving and calculations quicker. On a similar theme, we have been delighted to see so many Y1 and Y2 children doing well in the phonics screening test this week. There is nothing more important than learning to read. We are predicting better results than last year when 72% of children in Y1 passed. Thank you to all the parents who have helped and supported their children.

Y2 and Y5 went on trips yesterday, with Y2 going to Weston Super Mare and Y5 going to St John's in Warwick. Thank you to all the parents who volunteered to go. Without you it would have been difficult to go. I hope the children have some happy memories to take away from the day.

You will have noticed that the swimming pool has arrived and is on the front playground. We are looking forward to teaching the older children how to swim 25m and survival skills. Can I ask you to ensure your child/children are well supervised and within your sight, at the beginning and end of the day, especially while the pool is with us.

Next week we will be able to inform you who your child's teachers will be ready for the transition day on Wednesday 2nd July. Some children will have an enhanced transition package, to support the changes into a new year group.
